2009 ANNUAL MEETINGS

Division S6, Soil & Water Management and Conservation, continues to make a significant contribution to the success of the annual meetings. The Division was the lead sponsor on 18 sessions that included 282 total submissions for the 2009 meetings in Pittsburg. Of those 282 submissions, 164 were posters and 118 were oral papers. In addition, Division S6 cooperates with the Soil and Water Conservation Society for a special session that attracted an additional 9 invited papers.

SYMPOSIA

This year, each division was limited to two (2) symposia. The SSSA-SWCS Joint Symposium is an additional symposium offered at the society level.

Symposium 1: "Soil Management in Organic Production Systems"

The purpose of this symposium is to increase scientific knowledge in the design of organic production systems and to enhance interest in future research. The symposium consists of a three-speaker morning session and a four-speaker afternoon session with representation from industry, agency, and research organizations. Topics include soil nutrition, soil microbial health, the relation of plant health to soil health, soil amendments, foliar treatments, and crop yield and quality. Another topic to be discussed is the design of organic systems experiments.

Symposium 2: "Soil Carbon and Greenhouse Gas Dynamics in Agricultural Lands"

This symposium will focus on soil carbon and greenhouse gas dynamics in agricultural lands. A focus will be on the effects of soil management practices including reduced tillage, fertilizer amendments, crop rotation on carbon and greenhouse gas dynamics. In addition, presentations will address biofuel production from corn stover and the impacts of reduced corn residue on the soils properties, soil carbon dynamics and soil erosion. There is a world class line-up of presenters. The symposium includes an affiliated poster session in the afternoon of the same day.

2009 UNDERGRADUATE SPEECH CONTEST

2009 S-6 YOUNG SCHOLAR AWARD

2009 Recipient: Dr. Cristine Morgan, Assistant Professor of Hydropedology, Texas A & M University

The S06 Young Scholar Award recognizes scientists who have made an outstanding contribution in Soil and Water Management and Conservation within seven years of completing their Ph.D. The 2009 Young Scholar for Division S06 is Dr. Cristine Morgan.

Dr. Cristine Morgan received her Ph.D. in 2003 from the University of Wisconsin – Madison, and is currently an Assistant Professor of Hydropedology/Landscape Hydrology in the Department of Soil and Crop Sciences, Texas A & M University. She has authored or co-authored 19 refereed publications. Dr. Morgan teaches several classes, has advised three Texas A& M Undergraduate Research Scholars, and has served as chair or

committee member for graduate students. Her research involves determining the impact soil cracking has on watershed hydrology and quantifying and modeling macropore flow in shrink-swell soils.

S-6 GRADUATE STUDENT AWARD

2009 Recipient: Mr. Kendall DeJonge, Graduate Research Assistant, in the Department of Soil and Crop Sciences; and Ph.D. Candidate, in the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering Colorado State University, Fort Collins, CO.

The S6 Graduate Student Award is presented each year to a graduate student whose thesis research and graduate responsibilities utilize creative approaches to gain understanding and develop solutions for soil and water conservation and management problems. The recipient's research must be in soil and water management and conservation. The \$350 award is designed to assist the student with travel expenses

associated with attending the annual SSSA meeting. The recipient will be recognized at the Division S6 Business Meeting.

Kendall DeJonge is working with Drs. Neil Hansen and Allan Andales. His research focuses on irrigation scheduling and management for limited irrigation systems in Northern Colorado. This research includes study of field plots for evaluating various limited irrigation treatments. Water consumption and other field experimental data will be used to calibrate and validate numerical crop models, which will be used to increase irrigation efficiency. Prior to working at Colorado State, Mr. DeJonge worked as a Hydraulic Engineer with the US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), Hydrology Section. Omaha, NE. Mr. DeJonge received his M.S. and B.S. in Agricultural Engineering at Iowa State University, Ames, IA.

2009 Recipient: "Tillage, Nitrogen, and Cropping System Effects on Soil Carbon Sequestration" Authors: Ardell D. Halvorson, Brian J. Wienhold, and Alfred L. Black Citation: Soil Science Society of America Journal 66:906-912

Division S-06 honors the authors SSSAJ manuscripts published within the division of SSSAJ during the last seven years that have had exceptional impact on the scientific community. Selection is based on a rigorous evaluation of how the manuscript has advanced knowledge in the profession, the effectiveness of communication, originality, and impact measured by number of citations and downloads. The manuscript titled "Tillage, Nitrogen, and Cropping System Effects on Soil Carbon Sequestration" (Soil Sci. Soc. Am. J. 66:906–912 (2002)) was selected by the committee as the recipient of



the 2009 Best Paper Award. The paper has been downloaded 1,682 times and has been cited 80 times.
